



Trading Fair Since 1927

Since 1927 till today, Colombia's 300,000 small, independent coffee growers have not been alone in the vast world of international trade. The National Federation of Coffee Growers of Colombia, has, since then, supported and looked after the interests of the Cafeteros (coffee growers).

Created and managed by the coffee farmers, with the supervision of the Colombian government and supported by a tax on coffee exports, the Federation has succeeded in protecting the Cafeteros against falling coffee prices, as well as supporting the development of social programs such as access roads, safe and adequate water supplies, schools, electrification, housing, health centers and a number of coffee processing facilities.

The Cafetero has been able to benefit from low-cost loans, company stores and cooperatives, and training in managing and diversifying its crops.

Most important, the Federation establishes and maintains the highest standards for Colombian coffee, representing the difference between "a better deal" and an actual "good and fair deal" for the Colombian Cafetero.
